- AC.33.02: [32.2{31.02 (30.06 (30.12)}]: To consider MoU with NIRD-PR, Guwahati.
- Resolution: Registrar, NERIST is required to update regarding signing of MoU with NIRD-PR, Guwahati. If the MoU is already signed, the copy of the same may be made available in the next meeting of Academic Council. If MoU is not yet signed, the same may be completed at the earliest.

Further, it was decided in the meeting in context to the Agenda item No 43.02(a) (i), (ii) & (iii), which was referred to the Academic Council for decision as the scholars have already completed 4(Four) years of study. It was decided by the Academic Council that the addition in the clause 3.17.3 may be made as "conversion from full time to part time after completion of 4th year may be permitted in case the scholar gets the job and submits NoC from the employer. However, the tenure of 6 years as for full time shall remain same even after conversion and no extension shall be permitted."

Resolution: Approved and ratified.

AC. 35.8 To Consider the Various Agenda Items submitted by the Controller of Examinations.

[Note: The CoE has submitted 08 (eight) nos. of agenda items for discussions in the Academic Council Meeting and are placed at Annexure-VIII.

(01): Removal of Thesis title from Original Ph.D. Certificate:

[Note: It is to report that the PhD thesis title on the Original Certificate is creating operational issues leading to lot of difficulties faced by the candidate. It is also observed that this practice is not at par with the premier educational institutes of the country. So, it is suggested that the thesis title may be dropped from the final certificate but continued to be mentioned on the Provisional Degree Certificate as can be seen in the example copies enclosed in the Annexure. The NERIST existing format is also enclosed.]

Resolution: The proposal was not accepted by the Academic Council.

(02): Restructuring of back side of Grade Card.

[Note: The students graduated from NERIST are facing problems for class and medium of instruction not being mentioned in their Grade Card. So it is suggested that in future (after the existing stationary is exhausted), we can add these two things on the back side of the Grade Card mentioning Class (as per Academic Bye-Laws modified in the 33rd AC clause no. 2.10.1) and medium of instructions. The existing and proposed modified formats are enclosed]

Resolution: The proposal is accepted by the Academic Council.

(03) Medium of instruction to be added in Provisional Degree Certificate content.

[Note: The students graduated from NERIST are facing problem for medium of instruction not being mentioned in their Provisional Degree Certificate. So it is suggested that, in future, we can add the medium of instruction in the PDC. The existing and proposed modified formats are enclosed herewith.]

Resolution: The proposal is accepted by the Academic Council.

(04) Study tour grade submission problem.

[Note: In the new curricula for B. Tech. programme of NERIST adopted from Academic Year 2020-22, there is a mandatory Study Tour (XX23166) in the Third Year Fifth Semester. However, as per Academic Bye-Laws modified in the 33rd AC clause no. 2.11.2(b), they are supposed to undergo the tour in the Winter Break after Third Year Fifth egistrar Semester. Therefore, it is not feasible to award the grade against this subject in the July-NERIST, MoE, Govt. of December semester which concludes before the winter break. Hence, it is proposed to shift Nirjuli, Arunachal Pradesh this subject to Third Year Sixth Semester as XX23266, at par with the curriculum of B.Sc. Forestry. The curricula structures and the Bye-Laws clause are enclosed for reference and deliberation]

Resolution: The proposal was accepted by the Academic Council and shall be effective from Academic Year 2023-24. For the current academic year, the results may be withheld till the study tours are completed and grades are submitted after the winter vacation, and the result of the affected students may be published in later date with the M-Grade Examination result during January-May 2023 semester.

(05): DIGILOCKER NAD and Academic Bank of Credit (ABC)

[Note:UGC is sending us repeated reminders to upload the gradesheets/ transcripts/ and certificates to Digilocker NAD. Accordingly, the Institute account in the Digilocker NAD platform has been created and we are ready to operationalize it. However, in Digilocker NAD, it is not possible to render gradesheets or certificates in our format, but based on the data uploaded, the document gets rendered based on the selected template from their available options. Accordingly, the templates that may suit our requirement are enclosed for final selection by the Academic Council. Once selected, we can start uploading the results and certificates in the Digilocker NAD. Further, it may also be deliberated and decided if NERIST will upload the credits earned by the students in the ABC, which is a requirement for NEP 2020]

Resolution: The Academic Council has accepted adoption of Digilocker NAD and Academic Bank of Credit(ABC) in NERIST. Further, the formats of Gradesheet, Transcript, and Certificate, as suggested by Digilocker NAD Support Team suited to our existing formats was approved to be accepted by Dean (Academic) and CoE.

(06): To Incorporate the resolution of 11th Academic Council Meeting for gold medal in Academic Bye-Laws

[Note: It is observed that in Academic Bye-Laws for UG and PG the resolution vide agenda no AC 11.4 of of the 11th Academic Council Meeting held on 11.02.2011 was not incorporated till date. Hence, it is suggested that the following points may be inserted before printing of next Bye-laws with slight modification as mentioned against each:

UG: The first para should be replaced by: Medals are awarded at the time of (a) Convocation by the Institute to the branch-wise topper of Certificate and Degree (ET and Applied Science) students. A Committee recommends the names based on the following criteria: (i to v) (same as in Academic bye-laws). The sub-para (i) should be replaced with: The student should have highest CGPA (minimum 8.00 CGPA or 75% marks) (without 'I', FA or F grade) among the pass out students in the year.

PG: The first para should be replaced by: Medals are awarded at the time of Convocation by the Institute to the branch-wise topper of M.Tech./MBA/M.Sc. students. A Committee recommends the names based on the following criteria: (i to v) (same as in Academic bye-laws). The sub-para (i) should be replaced with: The NERIST, MoE, Govt. of India student should have highest CGPA (minimum 9.00 CGPA or 85% marks) (without Nirjuli, Arunachal Pradesh

(b)

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Registrar /

'I', FA or F grade) among the pass out students in the year irrespective of the number of students admitted in the Branch.

It may also be decided if the criteria should be same for both UG and PG since, at present, it is 75% for UG and 85% for PG (decided during the 5 point CGPA scale days when 75% meant 4.19/5.00 for UG and 4.5/5.00 meant 80% for PG), as stated above. Copies of AC Resolution 11.4, latest UG and PG Bye-laws are enclosed herewith for ready reference]

Resolution: The proposal under (a) & (b) was accepted by the Academic Council.

These modifications to the UG and PG Bye-laws are to be notified separately and maintained distinctly.

(07): Smooth Conduct of Semester Examinations.

Note: In recent years, it is observed that, due to increase in number of students (which will continue to increase till 2023-24 academic year) and increase in number of subjects per semester in the new curricula, there is an unprecedented pressure on the existing infrastructure and man power requirement during semester examinations. The number of invigilation duty per faculty was kept under control by double-sitting arrangement for the last two examinations, but the students and invigilators are facing difficulty as the room becomes too congested and stuffy. The Academic Council may deliberate and provide ideas on how it can be managed in future examinations. Further, after the pandemic, it has been observed that the students are deliberately carrying mobile phones in the examination room and trying to copy from it. The Academic Council may deliberate and suggest, if metal detector and frisking at the entry gates be implemented as a solution.]

Resolution: The Academic Council suggested that the present system for the conduct of semester examinations shall continue.

(08): End Semester Examination for July-December 2022 Semester:

[Note : As per Revised Academic Calendar, the End-Semester Examination (July-December, 2022) will be held during 5-14 December, 2022, but the seat allocation schedule for CSAB NEUT-2022, specified the last date for admission is on December 02, 2022, which is the last date of teaching as per our academic calendar. It will not be possible for the newly admitted students to sit on the End-Semester Examination from 5th December. Hence, it is suggested that the Academic Calendar Committee may be asked for rescheduling the End-Semester Examination after Winter Break, which will also give the newly admitted students through CSAB-NEUT some time to interact with their subject teachers (during 5-16 December 2022) and study (during Winter Break) before the exam begins. The seat allocation schedule for CSAB NEUT-2022 and Academic Calendar are enclosed.

The Academic Council may like to deliberate and decide on the above]

Registrar / Resolution: The End-Semester Examinations for all shall be conducted as per approved Academic Calendar (the theory exams should be of three-hour duration for Nifjull, Arunachal Pradesh marks for subjects for which Mid Semester Examinations weren't held, and for 50 marks for subjects for which Mid Semester Examinations were held). However, for the newly admitted students of B.Tech (1stYr) through JoSAA/CSAB-NEUT 2022

shall be conducted in the month of January along with M-Grade Examinations. All arrangement for extra classes, labs etc. for newly admitted students shall be done by the respective Departments and the course coordinators.

AC. 35.09 To Consider the Various Agenda Items submitted by the Chairman, NEE.

[Note: Chairman, NEE has been submitted 07 (seven) nos. agendas for discussions in the Academic Council Meeting and are placed at Annexure.

- (01): Creation of two new NEE Centres: The following two new centers are proposed for the smooth conduct of NEE:
 - **a.** Siliguri, West Bengal To reduce the load of Guwahati Centre and to enable the candidates of adjoining states of West Bengal, Bihar, UP & other states to appear the NEE, a new center is proposed at Siliguri, West Bengal.
 - b. Aalo, West Siang District, Arunachal Pradesh To enable the candidates of Aalo, West Siang, Si-Yomi, Siang, Lepa Rada, Upper Siang, and adjoining areas to appear for the NEE exams a new center is proposed at Aalo, West Siang District, Arunachal Pradesh.

Resolution: The proposal is not approved.

(02): Enhancement of online application fee from existing Rs 1000/- to Rs 1500/- for GEN/OBC/EWS categories and from Rs 600 to Rs 1000/- for SC/ST candidates.

Resolution: Approved.

(03): Enhancement of the rates of honorarium to NEE Invigilators: The rates of honorarium for the invigilators may be increased from existing Rs 1000 /- to Rs 1500/- per session because in all other State Level or National Level Test/Examinations the rates are more than Rs 1500/- plus lunch & refreshments for the invigilators are also served. Because of low rate of honorarium many a time there are difficulty in getting invigilators.

Resolution: Approved.

(04): Fixing of uniform rates for Room rent/Hall rent for conducting NEE: Operational difficulties are faced by the committee as there is no fixed rates for the Room/Hall for the conduct of NEE in different centers. Therefore, it is proposed that the Room/Hall Rent may be fixed as Rs 400/- per hall /Room per day.

Resolution: The Room rent/Hall rent for the conduct of NEE may be examined and recommended by the Dean(Acad) in consultation with CoE & Chairman, NEE and the approval of the recommendation may be obtained from the Chairman, Academic Council.

(05): Enhancement of the minimum rates for Centre Expenses: The existing rate for the Centre Expenses is Rs 20/- per candidates or minimum of Rs 2000/- per center where the candidates are less. Hence, it is proposed that the minimum amount of the Centre Expenses may be enhanced from Rs 2,000/- to Rs 5,000 where the candidates are less.

Registrar / NERIST, MoE, Govt. of India Nirjuli, Arunachal Pradesh Resolution: The Academic Council has approved the minimum amount of the Centre Expenses and enhanced from Rs. 2,000/- to Rs. 4,000 where the candidates are less.

(06): Scrapping of the NEE-II (Vocational) from the year 2023: As our Institute has already opted for 2+4 or 2+1 pattern therefore the record shows that there are no dropout students after completion of Base/Certificate module and the number of applicants for NEE-II(VOC) has drastically reduced in last four years. It is to inform that the expenses (question paper setting, printing etc) relating to the conduct of NEE-II(Vocational) is very high. Therefore, it is proposed that NEE-II (Vocational) may be scrapped from 2023.

Resolution: The proposal was not accepted.

(07): Admission of B. Tech courses through JEE: Our institute has already started taking admission from JEE for around 50%. It is proposed that admission for B. Tech may be made 100% from JEE. Or the entire process of conducting NEE may be handed over to NTA as it is a National Level Testing Agency and conducting numbers of National Level competitive Examinations and may be conducted at all over the parts of country.

The Academic Council may like to deliberate and decide on the above]

Resolution: The proposal was not accepted.

AC.35.10: To consider honorarium for Invigilation duties engaged to the Research Scholar.
